Financial Support for Families

Brunswick Secondary College understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- CSEF (Camps Sports and Activities Fund) provided by DET and automatically paid to family accounts. Applications via school. Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply. \$225 per year paid for eligible secondary school students. Special consideration eligibility category also exists CSEF payments will be processed directly to schools with majority of payments to commence from March 2023 onwards.

Payment Methods

2023 Course Confirmation process begins in November. These payments will then be processed as indicated on the forms. Methods include:

- Credit Card
- Cash or Cheque
- Via Compass Pay (Payment Instalments)
- BPAY

Refunds

All Camps, Activities and Incursions are fully self-funded.

- On site activities and Incursions at the College will not be refunded in the case of absence or withdrawal.
- One day activities will not be refunded in the case of absence or withdrawal.
- Camps – In the case of illness or withdrawal there may be opportunity to provide a partial refund where a camp provider is willing to refund the camp cost for your child. A written statement from a parent is necessary with a bona fide excuse. A request of a supporting Medical Certificate will be required.
- Tax Deductible Donations are unable to be refunded once an office tax-deductible receipt has been issued
- Instrumental Music Tuition - Where a family has requested a refund for any part of the Instrumental Music Tuition Levy, consideration will first be given to the costs incurred by the school in planning and arranging Instrumental Music Tuition instruction, as well as the cost of any non-returnable items provided to the student.
